

# 2018 Bond Pre-application Procedures Manual

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## I. Introduction

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs' (the "Department") Multifamily Bond Pre-application Submission Procedures Manual sets forth the basic information needed for filing a Private Activity Bond Pre-application. All sections of the manual must be followed when filing a Pre-application. This document is meant to serve only as a complementary guide on how to put the Pre-application together. Applicants are encouraged to familiarize themselves with all of the applicable state and federal rules that govern the programs for which they are applying and contact staff directly with any questions.

Prior to submitting a Pre-application, the Department will require the submission of the Pre-Inducement Questionnaire. The purpose of the questionnaire is for the Department to get a preliminary understanding of the proposed Development and to communicate with the Applicant the Department's objectives and policies regarding the development of affordable housing throughout the state using tax-exempt bond financing. The acceptance of the questionnaire by the Department does not constitute a pre-application or Application and does not bind the Department to any formal action regarding an inducement resolution. Staff will follow-up to discuss the next steps in the process. # II. 2018 Bond Pre-application Waiting List Submission Timeline

The Department is accepting applications for the 2018 Private Activity Bond Program. Preapplications will be accepted on a monthly basis with deadlines for submission outlined in a timeline found at <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>. All Pre-applications must be submitted before 5:00 p.m. Austin Local Time on the submission date. Pre-applications received each month will be scored and ranked against other Pre-applications for that month and will then be presented to the Department's Governing Board for consideration of an inducement resolution the following month.

# III. Pre-application Process

- The Applicant submits the Pre-application and corresponding Pre-application fees to the Department's Multifamily Finance Division. The Pre-application fees, pursuant to §12.10 of the Multifamily Housing Revenue Bond Rules and as further noted in Section IV must be submitted with the Pre-application in order for the Pre-application to be accepted by the Department.
- Department staff will review the Pre-application and request any additional information as applicable through the Administrative Deficiency process. The Applicant will have three (3) business days to correct any deficiencies. The Pre-application will be scored (according to 2018 scoring criteria) and ranked by highest score. Multiple site Pre-applications will be scored and ranked on their own merits. The Department will determine the final score for these Pre-applications based on an average of all the individual scores for submission to the Texas Bond Review Board.
- A summary of the proposed transaction will be presented to the Department's Governing Board for consideration of an Inducement Resolution.
- Upon Board approval, staff will submit an application for private activity bond volume cap to the
  Texas Bond Review Board (the "TBRB") to await a Certificate of Reservation, in order of
  descending score. The TBRB will issue reservations on a first come first serve basis (to issuers)

after all applications participating in the lottery (if applicable) have been reserved or withdrawn. The reservations will be issued in the order the Department submits.

# IV. Format for Submitting the Multifamily Bond Pre-application

The Pre-application for the Private Activity Bond program consists of two separate files, one in EXCEL format and one in PDF format. Pre-applications must be submitted through electronic transmission using the Multifamily Finance (MF) Serv-U Hypertext Transfer Protocal Secure (HTTPs) System. A completed and fully executed 2018 Electronic Application Filing Agreement must be completed and submitted in order to have access to the Serv-U portal. The current form can be found at the following link: <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>. Please complete and submit at least 3-5 business days prior to the anticipated Pre-application submission date to ensure sufficient time for processing. The form should be emailed to <a href="https://www.tdhca.state.tx.us">https://www.tdhca.state.tx.us</a>, <a href="mailto:nicole.fisher@tdhca.state.tx.us">nicole.fisher@tdhca.state.tx.us</a>, and <a href="mailto:jason.burr@tdhca.state.tx.us">jason.burr@tdhca.state.tx.us</a>. A TDHCA Application Number will be assigned at that time. <a href="mailto:IMPORTANT">IMPORTANT</a>: Identify ALL persons who should receive the setup/login information. This information will not be released by the Department to anyone other than the Applicant and those persons identified on this form.

For guidance on using Serv-U, refer to the Electronic Document Upload User Guide (MF Serv-U FTP) posted on the Department's Multifamily Apply for Funds page; which can be accessed at the link above.

For each Pre-application the Applicant must ensure execution of all necessary forms, supporting documentation, and place them in the appropriate order according to this manual. The submitted Pre-application should be the electronic copy created from the Excel file. Do not print and scan the Excel file. Do not print and scan the PDF file. Convert the Excel form to a PDF, and then insert scanned pages. Scanned copies of the Pre-application are difficult to read, are not searchable and raise questions regarding accuracy.

- 1. To download the electronic Pre-application file, right-click on the following link <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>, select "Save Target As" and choose the storage location on your computer. The Excel file should be named in the following format -- <TDHCA #\_Development Name Pre-application>.xls (e.g. 18601\_Austin\_Crossing Pre-application.xls).
- 2. Please do not transfer tabs from one Excel file to another, even if it is for the same Preapplication. If you plan to submit more than one Pre-application, please make additional copies of the 2018 Multifamily Bond Pre-application file **after** completing portions of the Pre-application that <u>are common</u> to all of your Pre-applications and prior to completing any portions that are not common to all of your Pre-applications.
- 3. Any cell that is highlighted yellow is available to be manipulated by the applicant. All other cells (unless specifically stated) are for Department use only, and have been pre-formatted to automatically calculate information provided, and are locked. Applicants may view any formulas within the cells. Applicants may not add additional columns or rows to the spreadsheets, unless otherwise stated.
- 4. All questions are intended to elicit a response, so please do not leave out any requested information. If references are made by the Applicant to external spreadsheets those references must be removed prior to submission to the Department as this may hamper the proper functioning of internal evaluation tools and make pertinent information unavailable to TDHCA.

- 5. When entering phone numbers or zip codes, enter numbers only with no blank spaces, parenthesis or hyphens, these cells are pre-formatted. Phone numbers will require area codes.
- 6. This electronic Pre-application has been designed so that some information and calculations are automatically populated once enough information has been entered. If you see a "#VALUE" or "DIV/0" in a cell these values should disappear upon data entry in other tabs. If they still exist, double check that all required information has been entered into the Preapplication.
- Tip Complete the Development Narrative and the Rent Schedule in the Development Activities and Finance Parts of the Pre-application first to take full advantage of the automated calculations.
  - 7. Be sure to save the file as you fill it out!
  - 8. Multiple site Pre-applications will be required to submit a separate Pre-application for each Site.
  - 9. All Pre-application materials must be submitted via the Department's secure web transfer server. The Applicant must physically deliver the following items by 5:00 p.m. Austin Local Time on the submission date as outlined in the timeline on the Department's website (<a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>):
    - o One complete hard copy of the 2018 Payment Receipt with check attached for the following fees associated with filing a Pre-application:
      - \$1,000 payable to Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs
      - \$2,500 payable to Bracewell, LLP; and
      - \$5,000 payable to the Texas Bond Review Board
  - 10. Support, opposition or neutral letters If the Applicant has received support, opposition or neutral letters from elected officials, neighborhood organizations and/or members of the public, they can be submitted at the time the Pre-application is submitted. If submitted within the Pre-application they should be bookmarked and labeled identifying them as such.

# V. Instructions for Converting the Excel file to PDF

Once the Excel Pre-application file is completed and you are ready to convert the file to PDF, follow these instructions:

Tip - Be sure to check all of the page breaks in the Excel files before you convert to PDF.

## Excel 2007 Users:

- 1. Click the **Microsoft Office Button**, point to the arrow next to **Save As**, and then click **PDF or XPS**.
- 2. In the **File Name** list, type or select a name for the workbook.
- 3. In the **Save as type** list, click **PDF**.

- 4. If you want to open the file immediately after saving it, select the **Open file after publishing** check box. This check box is available only if you have a PDF reader installed on your computer.
- 5. Next to **Optimize for**, do one of the following, depending on whether file size or print quality is more important to you:
  - If the workbook requires high print quality, click Standard (publishing online and printing).
  - If the print quality is less important than file size, click Minimum size (publishing online).
- 6. Click Options. Under Publish What select Entire Workbook and click OK.
- 7. Click **Publish**.

# **Excel 1997-2003 Users:**

- 1. With the Excel file open go to the Adobe PDF drop-down box from the task bar (if using Excel 2007 click on "Acrobat" tab in the task bar).
- 2. Select "Convert to Adobe PDF" from the drop-down list (Excel 2007- select "Create PDF").
- 3. The Adobe PDFMaker box will appear. One the left hand side of the box all of the sheets within the Excel file will be listed and you will be prompted to select the sheets you would like to covert to PDF. Once the sheets you want to convert are selected click on the "Add Sheets" button to move those sheets over to the right-handed side of the Adobe PDFMaker box, this will list the sheets selected to be converted to PDF.
- 4. Once all sheets you have selected appear on the right-hand side under "Sheets in PDF" click on the "Convert to PDF" button.
- 5. You will be prompted to create a name and save the PDF file. The PDF file should be named in the following format -- <TDHCA #\_Development Name Pre-application>.pdf (e.g.18601 Austin\_Crossing Pre-application.pdf).
- 6. A pop-up box will appear that asks "Do you want to proceed without creating tags?" Click Yes.

Remember that there are forms that require a signature. Once you have executed all required documents scan them and re-insert the scanned forms back into the order required. Applicants should double check the completeness prior to submission.

# VI. Creating Bookmarks

Once the file has been converted to PDF and all executed forms have been re-inserted into its appropriate location within the file, you will need to create Bookmarks. Bookmarks may or may not have already been created as part of the conversion process. You will need to designate or re-set the locations. To correctly set the Bookmark locations you must have the PDF file open in Adobe Acrobat.

Click on the Bookmark icon located on the left-hand side of the Adobe Acrobat screen, or go to the task bar and select these options in the following order:  $View \rightarrow Navigation Panels \rightarrow Bookmarks$ .

Optimal bookmark labels are about 15 characters or less, including spaces. This brevity almost completely eliminates scrolling up/down and expanding/collapsing the bookmarks panel. The instructions that follow are suggestions to help achieve this result. Do not indent any bookmark. This means that all bookmarks are to be on the same level and not in an outline format with category and subcategory headings. Set the text size of bookmarks to "small." Name the bookmark Tabs as "1," "2," "3," etc. instead of "Tab 1," "Tab 2," "Tab 3," etc. Do not designate a "Part" of the application or specify any breakdown other than the tab number, e.g. "Part 3 Tab 3" is stated simply as "3." If you desire bookmarks for subdivisions of tabs, such as the individual sections of a "Supporting Documentation" tab, use a one or two word descriptive name. Name the bookmarks associated with the Tabs using the names given by the instructions for completing each tab later in this manual. Do not wrap the text of bookmarks. Set the properties of each bookmark to open the page in "full page view."

If a Bookmark has already been created for each tab within the Excel file, simply re-set the bookmarks to the correct locations. To re-set the location for the Bookmarks, go to the first page of each separately labeled form/exhibit. You will then right-click on the corresponding Bookmark for the form/exhibit you are currently viewing. Select **Set Destination** and a pop-up box will appear asking you the following: "Are you sure you want to set the destination of the selected bookmark to the current location?" Select **Yes**.

If Bookmarks were not already created within the Excel file, then you will need to create these Bookmarks. Go to **Document** → **Add Bookmark**. Right-click on the first Bookmark and re-name it for the appropriate form or exhibit. You will then need to set the location of the Bookmark by going to the first page of each form or exhibit, right click on the corresponding Bookmark and select **Set Destination**. A pop-up box will appear asking you the following: "Are you sure you want to set the destination of the selected bookmark to the current location?" Select **Yes**.

Tabs within the Excel Application workbook have been color coded to distinguish between "Parts" of the Application consistent with this manual. Additionally, beside each bulleted item is a label to use for purposes of bookmarking the final PDF Pre-application file is included in parentheses.

If after conversion of the Excel file to PDF you have extra blank pages of any exhibit, you can delete those pages in order to limit the size of the file. To delete any extra, unnecessary pages identify the page number(s) you want deleted. On the Adobe Acrobat Task Bar click on Document and select Delete Pages from the drop down list. A box will appear prompting you to select which page(s) you would like to delete. Enter the page numbers to be deleted and hit OK.

The PDF formatted file must be checked for the following prior to submission:

- ✓ All tabs and/or volumes must be correctly bookmarked
- ✓ Files should average less than 100 kilobytes per page
- ✓ Files must be readable with free PDF file viewers including Adobe Reader and be compatible with Adobe Reader 5.0 and above
- ✓ Files should be saved so that "Fast Web View" (or page at a time downloading) is enabled
- ✓ Text within the PDF file should be searchable using the "Find" command in the PDF viewer

If you have any questions on using or experience difficulties with the Microsoft Excel based application, contact Teresa Morales via email at <a href="mailto:teresa.morales@tdhca.state.tx.us">teresa.morales@tdhca.state.tx.us</a>. In some instances a file may have small variations in bookmarks, file sizes, or readability that are not explicitly cited as requirements in the rule. Staff will use a reasonableness standard in determining when such deviations rise to the level of necessitating termination or other remedy.

# VII. Required Forms and Exhibits for the Pre-application

Throughout this manual, the names of any forms required are presented in *italics*. Each form must be completed; all questions must be answered and spaces completed. If a question does not pertain to the Development, mark "N/A." The complete PDF Pre-application file must be submitted in the order presented in the Excel file and detailed below. Note that some tabs in the workbook act as a placeholder for purposes of reminding Applicants of the supporting documents that must be provided within the Pre-application (*Applicants are encouraged to print out a blank version of each tab beforehand to be aware of all contents*.)

Pre-application submissions must include a Multifamily Document and Payment Receipt, as further detailed below.

# Multifamily Document & Payment Receipt

- All Applicants must submit a completed and executed (**hard copy**) original of this form with the Pre-application submission, along with a check for the correct fee amount in order for the Pre-application to be accepted by the Department.
- Include the TDHCA Application Number as assigned.
- For Applicants claiming a fee reduction based on a Qualified Nonprofit Organization status, evidence must be attached of the organization's status with the Payment Receipt.
- Insert a scanned copy of the completed Payment Receipt and check into the final PDF version of the Pre-application.
- If you would like a copy of the staff-signed Payment Receipt sent to you, please indicate so by checking the box below the signature line on the Payment Receipt.

# Part 1 - Certifications (Tabs 1-5)

The white colored tabs (1-5) in this section contain various certifications required by the Applicant. Additionally, this section contains basic contact information relating to the Preapplication.

#### **❖** Tab 1:

- Bond Pre-application Certification
- All of the cells highlighted yellow must be completed. The form must be signed by the Applicant or person with signatory authority to execute documents on the Applicant's behalf and must be dated and notarized. No hard copy is required, only a scanned copy within the PDF file.

#### **❖** Tab 2:

- Certification, Acknowledgement, and Consent of Development Owner
- This certification can be found on the Department's website at <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>.

- This form must be executed by the Development Owner and addresses the specific requirements associated with the Development. The Person executing the certification is responsible for ensuring all individuals referenced therein are in compliance with the certification. Applicants are encouraged to read the certification carefully as it contains certain construction and Development specifications that each Development must meet.
- Note that the certification has been revised to include the Applicant's understanding that all third party reports (when submitted with the full Application) will be posted on the Department's website.
- If any disclosures are required and anticipated to be addressed at the time of inducement, provide any relevant documentation pursuant to §10.101(a)(2) and (3) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules behind this tab.
- The form must be signed, dated, and notarized. No hard copy is required, only a scanned copy within the final PDF file. The originals must be retained, in the event they are requested by the Department.

## **❖** Tab 3:

- Applicant Eligibility Certification
- This certification can be found on the Department's website at <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>.
- This form must be executed by all individuals included on the organizational chart identified under §12.5(5); as well as §10.204(2)(A) (D) and who have the ability to exercise control. It identifies the various criteria relating to eligibility requirements associated with multifamily funding from the Department.
- The form must be signed, dated, and notarized. No hard copy is required, only a scanned copy within the final PDF file. The originals must be retained, in the event they are requested by the Department.

#### **❖** Tab 4:

- Mortgage Revenue Bond Program Responsibility of Costs Incurred
- Complete all of the yellow highlighted cells. The form must be signed, dated and notarized. A hard copy is not required, only a scanned copy within the PDF file.

#### **❖** Tab 5:

- Applicant Information Page
- This form should include contact information for the person responsible for responding to Administrative Deficiencies. Note that this may not necessarily be the Development Owner or Applicant. The person listed here will be required to submit requested documentation within a relatively short time period and should be generally available throughout the review process. The person listed here is also expected to be available primarily via email.

# Part 2 - Development Site (Tabs 6-13)

The blue colored Development Site tabs (6-13) collect information specific to the physical location of the Development Site.

#### **❖** Tab 6:

- Site Information Form Part I
- This form is divided into 7 parts. Complete the yellow highlighted cells in each part as applicable. Portions of this form may make reference to supporting documents required to be submitted behind Tab 7.
- Part 1 Development Address: Enter the information in this section as indicated by the label for each of the boxes present. If there is no mailing address for the site, please do not use phrases such as, "1 mile east of the corner" or "approximately 300 feet from" but only indicate direction from an intersection. For example, "the northeast quadrant of Hickory Street and Red River" Note: Participating jurisdictions are identified in the Application reference material.
- Part 2 Census Tract Information: Enter the applicable 11-digit 2010 census tract number with no dashes, commas, decimals, or spaces. Indicate whether the census tract is a Qualified Census Tract (QCT). Each of the subsequent highlighted cells further describing the demographics of the census tract will auto-populate. Address searches generally yield approximate census tracts matches and in some cases such searches are incorrect. It is the Applicant's responsibility to identify the correct census tract. Remember, if the poverty rate is greater than 40% for individuals (or 55% for Regions 11 and 13), it must be disclosed on the Development Owner Certification and the Undesirable Neighborhood Characteristics Report ("UNCR") should be submitted if requesting to have a determination on eligibility at the time of Inducement.
- Part 3 Request for Waiver: Mark the appropriate box, indicating whether or not a waiver is being requested, will be requested in the future at some point between the submission of the Pre-Application and full Application or not applicable and no request will be made. Applicants are encouraged to review §10.207 of the Uniform Multifamily Rules and confer with Department staff prior to submitting a waiver request.
- Part 4 Flood Zone Designation: Enter the FEMA description exactly as it appears on the FEMA floodplain map. Determine if the Site is inside or outside the 100-year floodplain according to the FEMA description corresponding to the FEMA code for the Development Site that appears on the map. Requirements regarding the floodplain are specified in detail in §10.101(a)(1) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
  - Evidence dated not more than 6 months prior to the date of submission must be submitted behind Tab 7.
- Part 5 School Rating: Enter the information into this section as applicable and as required per §10.101(a)(3)(B)(iv). Please include the 2017 TEA rating documents in the Application.
  - The Pre-application allows you to identify up to five public schools, the grade levels served at those schools, and whether or not the school has a Met Standard rating from TEA.
  - o These schools may need to be combined to obtain the overall rating for each type of school (elementary, middle, or high school). Refer to §10.101(a)(3) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules in order to determine what schools may need to be combined to meet TEA requirements.
  - Check the appropriate box if the school district has no attendance zones and provide evidence of such or provide the school attendance zone map with the Development location labeled.
  - o Include supporting documentation behind the tab, including but not limited to printouts from the TEA website indicating school ratings. If all schools Met Standard for all three years, only the 2017 TEA information is required.

- o NOTE: If any elementary, middle, or high school does not have a Met Standard rating for 2017, submit the Undesirable Neighborhood Characteristics Report with supporting documentation.
- **Part 6 Underserved Area:** Select from the five options available if requesting the 2 points for this item.
- **Part 7 Declared Disaster Area:** Select the box if requesting the 7 points for this item. The 2018 list of eligible counties are posted on the Department website at the following link <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>.

#### **❖** Tab 7:

- Site Information Form Part I Supporting Documentation
- **Street Map** with the location and approximate shape of the Site clearly outlined.
- **Census Tract Map** must indicate the full 11-digit number and identify the location of the Development Site.
- **Evidence of any Waiver Requests** should include an explanation of the waiver and must meet the requirements of §10.207 of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
  - NOTE: Applicants should be aware that the Certification, Acknowledgement and Consent of Development Owner includes a stipulation that the Site is not located in an area with undesirable site features or undesirable neighborhood characteristics as described in §10.101(a)(2) and (3) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
- Evidence of Flood Zone Designation must include a FEMA flood map with the Development Site location identified. Refer to the Uniform Multifamily Rules Subchapter B Site and Development Requirements and Restrictions §10.101(a)(1), and Subchapter D Environmental Site Assessment Rules and Guidelines, §10.305(b)(3) for further information.
  - NOTE: The Certification, Acknowledgement and Consent of Development Owner includes a stipulation regarding the conformity of the Site with the Department's rules regarding the floodplain.

#### School Rating:

- o The table allows you to identify up to five public schools, the grade levels served at those schools, and whether or not the school has a 2017 Met Standard rating from TEA.
- o These school may need to be combined to obtain the overall rating for each type of school (elementary, middle, or high school). Refer to §10.101(a)(3) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules in order determine what schools may need to be combined to meet TEA requirements.
- Check the appropriate box if the school district has no attendance zones and provide evidence of such.
- o Include supporting documentation behind the tab, including but not limited to printouts from the TEA website indicating school ratings. If all schools Met Standard for all three years, only the 2017 TEA information is required.
- Evidence of Underserved Area should include one of the following:
  - o For Sites located within a Colonia, a map must be submitted defining the geographic area that is to be considered a colonia, pursuant to §11.9(c)(5)(A) of the QAP. Evidence of the boundaries of the colonia from the Office of the Attorney General and a map showing the colonia is located within 150 miles of the Rio Grande River border is also required. A map of colonias can be found by going to the Attorney General's website at

- o For Sites located within an economically distressed area, provide evidence that the Site is in a location that has both of the following characteristics:
  - A census tract that has a median household income that is 75 percent or less of the statewide median household income, and
  - A municipality or county that has been awarded EDAP funds administered by the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) within the five (5) years ending at the time of Pre-application submission. Review the "EDAP status report" which can be found on the TWDB website at <a href="Economically Distressed Areas Program">Economically Distressed Areas Program</a> | Texas Water Development Board
- To indicate developments in a census tract that has not received a competitive tax credit allocation or a 4% non-competitive tax credit allocation for a Development less than 15 years and that continues to appear on the Department's inventory; or a tract that has not had a Development that was awarded less than 30 years; or a census tract and all contiguous census tracts (that are in a city with a population of more than 150,000) that have not received an award or allocation within the past 15 years and continues to appear on the Department's inventory provide a copy of the applicable section of the HTC Property Inventory.
- **Declared Disaster Area** requires no additional evidence, only to select the points. The 2018 list of eligible counties are posted on the Departments website at the following link: <a href="http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm">http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/multifamily/apply-for-funds.htm</a>.

#### **❖** Tab 8:

- Site Information Form Part III
- This form is divided into 4 parts. Complete the yellow highlighted cells in each part as applicable. Portions of this form may make reference to supporting documents required to be submitted behind Tab 9.
- Part 1 Site Acreage: Complete the site acreage as identified in both the Site Control documentation and boundary survey. Both should agree. Any discrepancies in the sizes of the land stated in either of the responses should be explained in the space provided.
- Part 2 Site Control: Complete the yellow highlighted cells identifying the seller, date of sale and any relationship between the seller and the Applicant and/or any member of the Development Team. Provide an explanation regarding any affiliations.
  - o Identify all of the sellers of the proposed Property for the 36 months prior to the submission of the Pre-application and their relationship, if any, to members of the Development Team.
- Part 3 Site Control (Ingress/Egress and Easements): If land for ingress and/or egress and any easements is held separately from the property described in the site control documents, describe how the land is held. Documentation of the rights of ingress/egress must be included within site control. Select the appropriate response from the drop down menu and if applicable provide a description in the box.
- Part 4 30% increase Eligible Basis ("Boost"): Complete this section if the proposed Development Site is eligible for the 30% increase in eligible basis as further described in §11.4(c)(1) and (2) of the QAP.
  - Developments may be eligible if they are located in a QCT that has less than 20%
     HTC Units per total households in the tract as established by the U.S. Census

Bureau for the 5-year American Community Survey. If located in a QCT with greater than 20% HTC Units per total households, the Development is still eligible for the boost provided a resolution is submitted stating the Governing Body of the appropriate municipality or county containing the Development has by vote specifically allowed the construction of the new Development. Such resolution is not required at the time of Pre-application, but is a requirement of the full Application. As a general rule, a QCT designation would have to coincide with the program year the Certificate of Reservation is issued. **OR** 

o The Development is located in a Small Area Difficult Development Area (SADDA) as outlined in §11.4(c)(2). Evidence should include a SADDA map that clearly identifies the proposed Development is located within the boundaries of a SADDA. As a general rule, a SADDA designation would have to coincide with the program year the Certificate of Reservation is issued.

#### **❖** Tab 9:

- Site Information Form Part III Supporting Documentation
- **Evidence of Site Control** should be provided behind this tab.
  - At Pre-application site control must be valid through the date of the Board meeting at which the inducement resolution is to be considered.
  - O At full Application, the Applicant must be able to provide evidence that the Development Owner has the ability to compel legal title at any time while the Application is under consideration. It should be noted that the potential expiration of site control does not warrant the full Application being presented to the TDHCA board prior to the scheduled meeting.
  - Site control must be in the name of the Development Owner or an Affiliate of the Development Owner and does not expressly preclude an ability to assign the site control to the Development Owner or another party.
  - Evidence of site control must be in one of the forms described under §10.204(10) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
  - o In the case of land donations, Applicants must demonstrate that the entity donating the land has Site Control as evidenced through one of the forms described in §10.204(10) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules or other documentation found to be acceptable to the Department.
  - o If a recorded warranty deed is submitted, the corresponding executed settlement statement or equivalent must be included.
  - o If a contract for sale is provided as evidence of site control, the closing date must be highlighted or flagged.
  - o If the closing date is contingent upon other dates within the purchase contract, provide an outline of these dates that arrive at the current closing date identified.
  - Contracts must have an address, legal description, or property description that matches the city, county and/or zip code indicated in the *Site Information Form Part I*.
  - o Contract must be signed by both seller and buyer.
  - o Proof of consideration, as specified in contract, must be submitted. (*e.g.*, a completed escrow receipt from the title company signed by the escrow agent).
  - For scattered sites, if you are submitting multiple contracts, deeds, etc. each one must meet all of the requirements of §10.204(10) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules. Each must clearly have the address identified and be consistent with the Multiple Site Information Form (e.g. If the Development consists of 3 parcels of

- land, 3 contracts/deeds, etc. must be provided or one form of site control must clearly identify and cover all 3 parcels).
- o For identity of interest transactions, submit documentation requirements described in Subchapter D §10.302(e)(1)(B) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
- **Site Control (Ingress/Egress and Easements):** Select the appropriate response from the drop down menu and if applicable provide a description in the box.
- **Boundary Survey** or plat must clearly identify the location and boundaries of the subject Property.
  - O If the tract of land being purchased is larger than the portion being used for the Development; the survey must depict both the larger tract as well as the site to be developed.
  - The survey must clearly delineate the flood plain boundary lines and show all easements.
  - Site acreage should be provided and be consistent with the *Site Information Form Part III* and any submitted site control documents.
- Evidence of 30% Increase Eligible Basis ("Boost"), if the Development is located in a SADDA as further described in §11.4(c)(2). A SADDA map that clearly identifies the proposed Development is located within the boundaries of said SADDA must be provided.

#### **❖** Tab 10:

- Multiple Site Information Form
- The Multiple Site Information Form should be used as an aid to determine how lots and tracts that have separate descriptions fit together to form the complete Development. If the Pre-application requires the submission of more than one contract for sale, lease contract or deed as evidence of Site Control, then the Applicant should complete a corresponding block on this form for each separate Site. In general, the Pre-application must sufficiently describe the properties in the contracts and deeds so that each property can be identified within the survey(s) of the Development Site(s). The evidence must show that the land delimited by the survey of the Development Site is entirely under the Applicant's Control and any land that is purchased in excess of the Development Site must be described in a way that makes the excess area apparent in both quantity and location. A further explanation of the information requested for multiple site development proposals is provided by the instructions for filling out the Multiple Site Information Form in the Pre-application itself.

# **❖** Tab 11:

- Elected Officials Form
- Notifications to elected officials and any neighborhood organizations must be made no later than the date the Pre-application is submitted to the Department.
- List each elected official and their respective District/Precinct.
- Select the box at the top of the form confirming whether or not support, opposition or neutral letter(s) have been included. The Applicant must notify the:
  - State Senator and State Representative of the district(s) that contain the Development,
  - Superintendent and presiding officer of the board of trustees of the school district containing the Development,
  - o Presiding officer and all elected members of the Governing Body of the municipality (if the Development Site is within a municipality or its extraterritorial jurisdiction) containing the Development,

- Presiding officer and all elected members of the Governing Body of the county containing the Development, and
- o Neighborhood Organizations on record with state or county whose boundaries include the Development Site.
- **Public School contact information**. The name of the elementary school and high school closest to the Development Site, address and phone number for each school must also be included on this form for the purposes of scheduling the TEFRA bond public hearing. Schools indicated on this form should also be located within the same school district as the proposed Development location.
- The notifications must not be older than three (3) months prior to the submission of the Pre-application.
- The Department is not responsible for notifying Applicants if information contained in the *Elected Officials* form is inaccurate. It is each Applicant's sole responsibility to ensure all information contained in this form is accurate and that any errors identified are corrected and proper re-notifications are made.
- Re-notification will be required if a change is made between the submission of the Preapplication and Application that reflects a total Unit increase of greater than 10 percent or a 5 percent increase in density (calculated as units per acre) as a result of a change in the size of the Development Site. Additionally, if there should be a change in an elected official between the submission of a Pre-application and the submission of an Application, Applicants are required to notify the newly elected (or appointed) official.
- Please note this form is considered to be part of the *Certification of Notifications* Form.

#### **❖** Tab 12:

- Neighborhood Organizations Form
- Complete the form, as applicable, identifying all Neighborhood Organizations, whose boundaries include the Development Site and are on record with the county or state as of 30 days prior to the Pre-Application submission date. For this item, "on record with the state" means on record with the Secretary of State.
- The Department is not responsible for notifying Applicants if information contained in the *Neighborhood Organizations* form is inaccurate. It is each Applicant's sole responsibility to ensure all information contained in this form is accurate and that any errors identified are corrected and proper re-notifications are made.

# **❖** Tab 13:

- *Certification of Notifications at Pre-application* Form
- Complete the yellow highlighted cells in each part as applicable.
- The form must be signed, dated and notarized. The individual signing the certification must be the Applicant or the person that has the authority to sign on behalf of the Applicant.
- Notifications should be made using a form of delivery that can be tracked in order to retain proof of delivery in the event it's requested by the Department.

Also included in this section are scoring items relating to Unit sizes, extended affordability and preservation initiatives.

# **❖** Tab 14:

- Development Narrative
- This form is divided into 8 parts. Complete the yellow highlighted cells in each part as applicable.
- **Part 1 Construction Type**: Choose one Construction type from the drop-down menu and answer all appropriate questions. If questions are not relevant, answer with N/A.
- Part 2 Target Population: Identify the Target Population from the drop-down menu provided. Elderly Limitation and Elderly Preference have been added as options to the drop-down menu for Target Population. Refer to §10.3(a)(47) of the 2018 Uniform Multifamily Rules for more information on how Elderly Development is defined. If Elderly Preference is proposed, complete the statement in this section by choosing the funding source from the drop-down menu in the space provided and submit supporting documentation for that financing behind the tab. It is the Applicant's responsibility to identify the correct Target Population.
- Part 3 Staff Determinations: If a staff determination was made pursuant to §10.3(b) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules, mark the box with an "x" and submit a copy of the determination behind this tab. If no determination was required, simply leave the box blank.
- **Part 4 Narrative**: Applicants are required to provide a brief development narrative and should also use this space as an opportunity to explain any unique circumstances surrounding the proposed Development. Please make sure that any specific information provided here about the development is consistent with information provided in other parts of the application.
- Part 5 Funding Request: Applicants should carefully fill in all applicable cells highlighted in yellow.
  - There is no internal check on funding amounts built in to the Pre-application, so Applicants should also be aware of any funding limit requests before completing this form.
  - Clicking on the funding sources (TDHCA Multifamily Direct Loan (Repayable),
     TDHCA Multifamily Direct Loan (Deferred Forgivable), Housing Tax Credits, etc.)
     will link Applicants to the summary of sources and uses page behind Tab 23.
- Part 6 Set Aside: This section is only applicable to Multifamily Direct Loan Applications.
- Part 7 Previously Awarded State and Federal Funding: All cells highlighted in yellow require data entry by the Applicant. If a particular question is not applicable to the Pre-application, type in "N/A".
- Part 8 Qualified Low Income Housing Development Election: Select one of the options, as applicable to the Development. Applicants should understand that once an election is made, it is irrevocable. Applicants are encouraged to check this election against the *Rent Schedule* and *Residential Rental Attachment* (RRA) to ensure consistency.

#### **❖** Tab 15:

Development Activities

- This form is divided into 6 parts. Complete the yellow highlighted cells in each part as applicable.
- Part 1 Common Amenities: This item will self populate from the *Rent Schedule* based on the total number of units in the Development. Applicants must fill in the appropriate number of points associated with amenities according to §12.6(6) of the Multifamily Housing Revenue Bond Rules. All Applicants must mark the box affirming the common amenities will be provided.
  - o The list of common amenities can be found in §10.101(b)(5) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
  - An actual identification of the amenities to be provided will be required at the time the LURA is submitted to the Department.
  - Pre-applications for non-contiguous scattered site housing, excluding noncontiguous single family sites, will have the threshold test applied based on the number of Units per individual Site. Amenities to be provided at each individual Site will be identified in the LURA.
- Part 2 Unit Requirements: One selection each from Part A and Part B must be made.
  - Part A the Applicant must select the box acknowledging the Development will meet the required minimum unit sizes, OR if Rehabilitation, select the box as applicable.
  - O Under Part B, Unit Features, the Applicant must select the box indicating that a minimum of 7 points worth of amenities will be provided.
  - The list of unit amenities and corresponding point structure can be found in §10.101(b)(6)(B) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules.
  - An actual identification of the unit amenities to be provided will be required at the time the LURA is submitted to the Department. Selected amenities must be maintained throughout the State Restrictive Period.
  - o Pre-applications for non-contiguous scattered site housing will be required to have a specific amenity located within each Unit to receive points.
- Part 3 Tenant Supportive Services: This section must be completed if requesting the 8 points. NOTE: While the provision of a minimum of 8 points is a mandatory requirement for Tax-Exempt Bond Developments at the time of full Application pursuant to §10.101(b)(7) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules, selection of points at the time of Preapplication is the Applicant's choice and, for the most part, is usually dependent upon competition for volume cap.
  - o The list of services can be found in §10.101(b)(7).
  - o Identification of the services to be provided will be required at the time the LURA is submitted to the Department.
- **Part 4 Extended Affordability:** Select the yellow highlighted cell if requesting the 2 points.
- **Part 5 Preservation Initiative:** Select the yellow highlighted cell if requesting the 10 points. Evidence of the existing affordability must be submitted behind this tab.
- Part 6 Development Accessibility Requirements: Select the highlighted cell as acknowledgement of the requirements in §10.101(b)(8) of the Uniform Multifamily Rules. Applicants proposing New Construction where some units are normally exempt from Fair Housing requirements should pay special attention to ensure that the design of the Development is in compliance with the rule.

# **Part 4 – Finance (Tabs 16-20)**

The yellow colored Finance specific tabs (16-20) contain information regarding the Development costs and the proposed financing structure.

#### **\*** Tab 16:

- Rent Schedule
- Gross Rent cannot exceed the HUD maximum rent limits unless documentation of project-based rental assistance is provided.
- If any non-rental income is included, describe the source(s) of the income. "Misc" income is not an acceptable description.
- If the Development includes loft/efficiency Units, label these Units as "0" bedrooms as provided in the drop-down list.
- If applying for TDHCA Multifamily Direct Loan funds the column titled "MF Direct Loan Units (Rent/Inc)" also includes the Income level required for each MF Direct Loan Unit designation.
- Private Activity Bond Priority:
  - o Space has been provided at the top of the form to identify the Private Activity Bond Priority. Choose the applicable priority from the drop-down list.
  - o Points will be awarded based on the Priority selected and must be consistent with the *Bond Review Board Residential Rental Attachment* behind Tab 25.
  - Priority must be designated, as anticipated to be submitted to the Bond Review Board. The priority designations include the following:
  - o Priority 1(a): Set-aside 50% of the Units at 50% AMGI and 50% of the Units at 60% AMGI.
  - o Priority 1(b): Set-aside 15% of the Units at 30% AMGI and 85% of the Units at 60% AMGI.
  - o Priority 1(c): Set-aside 100% of the Units at 60% AMGI for Developments located in a census tract with a median income that is higher than the median income of the county, MSA or PMSA in which the census tract is located.
  - o Priority 2: Set-aside 80% of the Units at 60% AMGI; up to 20% of the Units can be at market rate.
  - o Priority 3: Includes any qualified residential rental Development. Market rate Units can be included under this priority.

#### **❖** Tab 17:

- Annual Operating Expenses
- Fill in all yellow highlighted cells.
- You must describe any "Other" cost included in any of the expense categories. "Misc" is not an acceptable description. The cells will turn RED and state "please describe" to remind you to enter a description.
- Annual Debt Service should be consistent with information provided in the *Summary of Sources and Uses of Funds* form as well as the *15-Year Pro Forma*.
- Expense per Unit, Expense to Income ratio, and Debt Service Ratio will be calculated automatically. Applicants should familiarize themselves with the underwriting rules (Subchapter D of the Uniform Multifamily Rules) regarding thresholds for these items.

#### **♦** Tab 18:

• 15-Year Pro Forma

- Any deferred developer's fee must be shown to be fully repaid by year 15.
- Enter rental concessions as a negative value.
- You must describe any "Other" debt service included in the pro forma.

#### **❖** Tab 19:

- Development Cost Schedule
- All applicable yellow highlighted cells under the Total Development Summary (columns C, D, and E) should be completed. A section for notes regarding the costs is provided as well; this should be used to add any information that could be helpful for the underwriting review, to explain line items that may be particularly low or high costs.
- This form separates contingency from general requirements, overhead and profit Developer fees are at the bottom of the form, after soft costs and financing costs.
- **NOTE**: No syndication costs should be included in the Eligible Basis.
- The "Credits Supported by Eligible Basis" cell is automatically calculated from data reflected in the "Calculated Credits" cell. This figure must be equal to or greater than the annual Housing Tax Credit Funding Request.
- If a 130% High Cost Area Adjustment is included in the *Development Cost Schedule* the Application should meet §11.4(c)(1) or (2) of the QAP and indicate such in Part 3 of the *Site Information Form Part III*.
- You must describe any "Other" costs reflected in the *Development Cost Schedule*. The cells will prompt you when an amount is inserted to "please specify" under a footnote.
- Include the contact name and phone number in the space provided of the person providing the cost estimate for the Hard Costs.

## **❖** Tab 20:

- Finance Narrative and Summary of Sources and Uses of Funds
- Identify the name of each Financing Participant in the left-hand column. (Note that Department Funds have been auto populated based on data entered on the Development Narrative Tab, and are hyperlinked to move back and forth between tabs.)
- Choose the Funding Descriptions from the drop-down list for *Debt* and *Third Party Equity*:
  - o conventional loan,
  - o conventional/FHA,
  - o conventional/letter of credit,
  - o mortgage revenue bonds,
  - Housing Trust Fund,
  - o CDBG,
  - o USDA/TXRD loan,
  - o federal loan,
  - o state loan,
  - o local government loan, or
  - o private loan.
- Note that the Funding Description column under "deferred developer fee" and "other" do not have drop-down menus. Applicants should write in a funding description.
- For each source identified you are required to include the interest rate, amortization, term and syndication rate, where applicable. THE INFORMATION INCLUDED HERE MUST BE CONSISTENT WITH THE FINANCING NARRATIVE, TERM SHEETS (if available), AND DEVELOPMENT COST SCHEDULE.

- The priority of lien must be indicated in the "Lien Position" column for interim and permanent financing.
- Total sources of funds in the "Permanent Period" portion of the form must equal the total uses of funds reflected in the *Development Cost Schedule*.
- Enter a description of the financing plan in the space provided, again ensuring that any information provided here is consistent with other exhibits in the Pre-application. Sources and amounts of funds referenced in this narrative must match the *Summary Sources and Uses of Funds*, term sheets for interim and permanent financing (if available) and term sheets for syndication of tax credits (*if available at the time of Pre-application*).
- The narrative should identify any non-traditional financing arrangements; use of funds with respect to the Development; funding sources including construction, permanent, bridge loans, rents, operating subsidies, and replacement reserves; and commitment status of funding sources for the Development.
- Submit any supporting documents or terms sheets if available at the time of Preapplication.

# Part 5 - Organization Documents (Tabs 21-24)

The green colored tabs (21-24) include all information regarding the Development Team members. The Organizational Charts, Entity Registration documents and Nonprofit Participation exhibits are all included in this section.

## **❖** Tab 21:

- Owner and Developer Organization Charts Form
- This sheet shows a basic format for organizational charts. Be sure that charts follow the example given and that they contain the following information:
  - Correct name and ownership percentage of each entity and person. Avoid nicknames;
  - o Clear indication of role, i.e. Member, Member/Manager, Class B, LP, etc.
  - o Trusts must include the trustee and list all beneficiaries that have the legal ability to access, control, or direct activities of the trust and are not just financial beneficiaries;
  - Nonprofit entities, public housing authorities and publicly traded corporations must show name of organization, individual board members and executive director;
  - For individual board members, indicate those board members that have the ability to exercise control. Any other persons with the power to exercise control must also be identified:
  - o In cases of to-be-formed instrumentalities of PHAs where the board members and executive director remain to be determined, the PHA itself is shown;
  - Ownership must be illustrated to the level of natural persons, whether owners or board members.
- Developer organization chart shows the structure of the Developer and includes the following:
  - o Any Person receiving more than 10% of the Developer Fee;
  - o Nonprofit entities, public housing authorities and publicly traded corporations show name of organization, individual board members and executive director;
  - Ownership to the level of natural persons, whether owners or board members;
  - Any other relationships involving the power to control the Applicant directly or indirectly.

• Create separate charts for the Owner and Developer and Guarantor, ensuring that all three are complete representations of the structures of each, and attach them behind this exhibit.

# **❖** Tab 22:

- List of Organizations and Principals Form
- Complete the yellow highlighted cells as needed, beginning with the legal name of the Applicant.
- All organizations **AND** persons will be listed on this form.
- Each **entity** will have its own section, in which its individual structure will be given.
- Select the appropriate TDHCA experience for each person from the Yes/No drop-down menu. Make a selection for each entry.
- Indicate whether the entity has the ability to exercise control over the Development.
- Be sure names match the organizational charts. Avoid nicknames.
- Additional spaces for Sub-Entities or Principals are available by un-hiding rows. (There are 30 entries available for sub-entities or Principals).
- Submit as many pages of the form as necessary to report all organizations and natural Persons and Developers. Organizations that are Developers and/or Guarantors must also be listed on this form as must any organization and natural person whose ownership interest in an applicable entity is direct instead of via membership in an organization.
- All information that the form solicits must be legible in the Acrobat version of the form (reduce the font size or make other provisions as necessary to accomplish this).
- When converting to PDF format, be sure to adjust page breaks as necessary and keep all information legible.

#### **❖** Tab 23:

- Supporting Documentation for Organization Documents
- Provide the Certificate of Reservation from Texas Secretary of State; or
- Evidence of Entity Registration from the Texas Secretary of State; and
- Franchise Tax Account Status from the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts
- Evidence of Authority to do business in Texas.

#### **❖** Tab 24:

- Nonprofit Supporting Documents
- Provide behind this tab the IRS Determination Letter which states that the nonprofit organization is a §501(c)(3) or (4) entity. This designation must be in place as of the beginning of the Application Acceptance Period. If the organization is a Qualified Nonprofit Organization as defined in the tax code, notwithstanding any apparent limitations in the QAP about the particular parts of the Code under which a nonprofit may qualify, submit an IRS determination letter.

# Part 6 - Additional Information (Tabs 25-27)

The orange colored tabs (25–27) require supplemental documents to be submitted as well as the Private Activity Bond scoring form.

- **NOTE:** Please note that this list is a guide and is not comprehensive. Applicants are encouraged to familiarize themselves with all of the applicable state and federal rules that govern the programs they are applying for as well as to read the Multifamily Housing Revenue Bond Rules, Multifamily Direct Loan Rule, Uniform Multifamily Rules and the Housing Tax Credit Qualified Allocation Plan.

# VIII. Full Application Process & General Eligibility Information

Once the Inducement Resolution has been approved by the Department's Board, the application will be submitted to the TBRB in the rank order determined by the Department and as outlined in the Multifamily Housing Revenue Bond Rules to await a Certificate of Reservation. The Priority designation selected by the Applicant will trigger the deadlines for submission of the HTC and Bond Application. There is not a cumulative ceiling to these types of Applications; however, to the extent that there is a bond ceiling governed by the Texas Bond Review Board, the quantity of corresponding 4% Housing Tax Credit Applications may be limited.
