

Embracing Veterans Experiencing Homelessness back into the workforce

"Embracing Veterans experiencing homelessness back into the workforce," is a proposed program that would work with rural and mid-sized communities that have or that are working on effectively ending Veteran homelessness. The goal would be to use the funds to deploy a VISTA member in the community to build a network of volunteers to assist Veterans to gain employment and secure or maintain housing. The volunteer-based community support network will use the tools created by our VISTA members to guide their work connecting Workforce Centers with LHCs. Also, they will use community mentoring practices to support Veterans. The project's goals in each community would be to:

- 1. Create or strengthen a workforce CoC/Local Homeless Coalition/VA collaboration to serve people experiencing homelessness, specifically Veterans for this project.
- 2. Develop a community support network from various community systems (Veteran advocates, VFW

 - b. Offer direct assistance through employment navigation services.
- 3. House or assist Veterans in maintaining housing through completion of the final project report.
