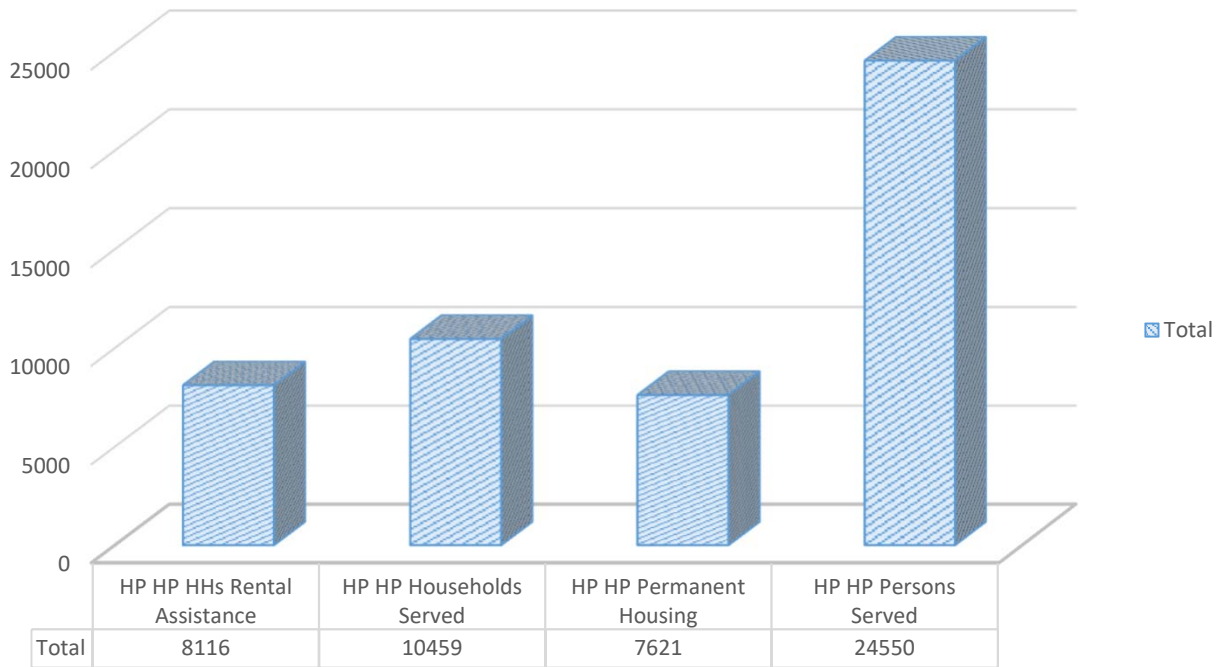

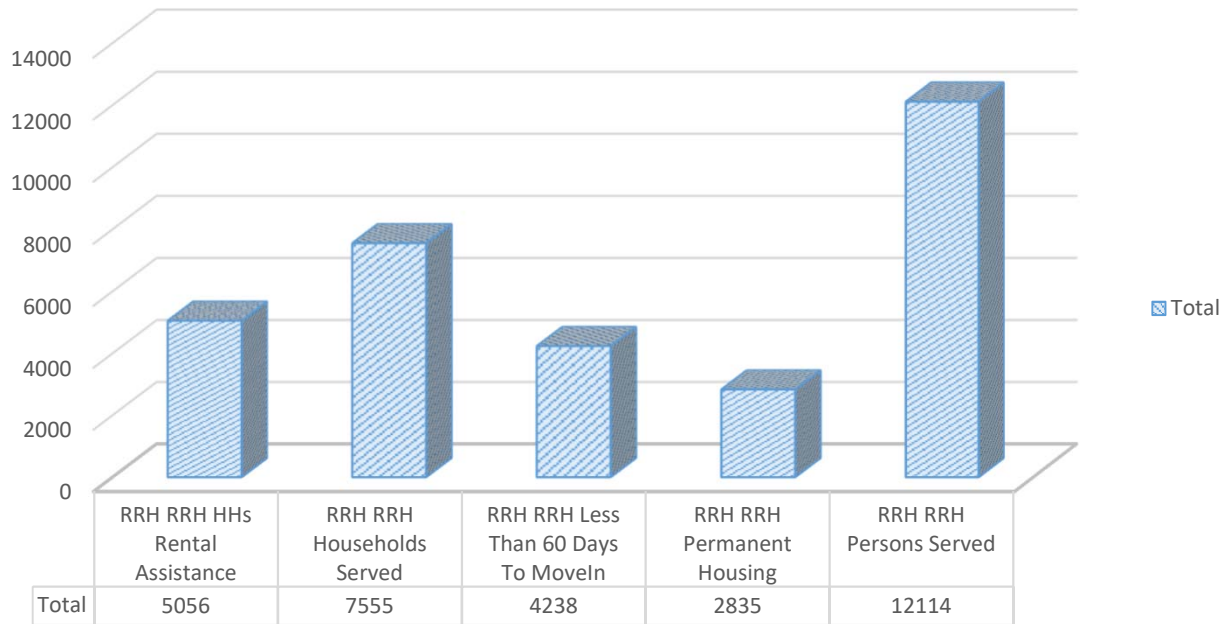

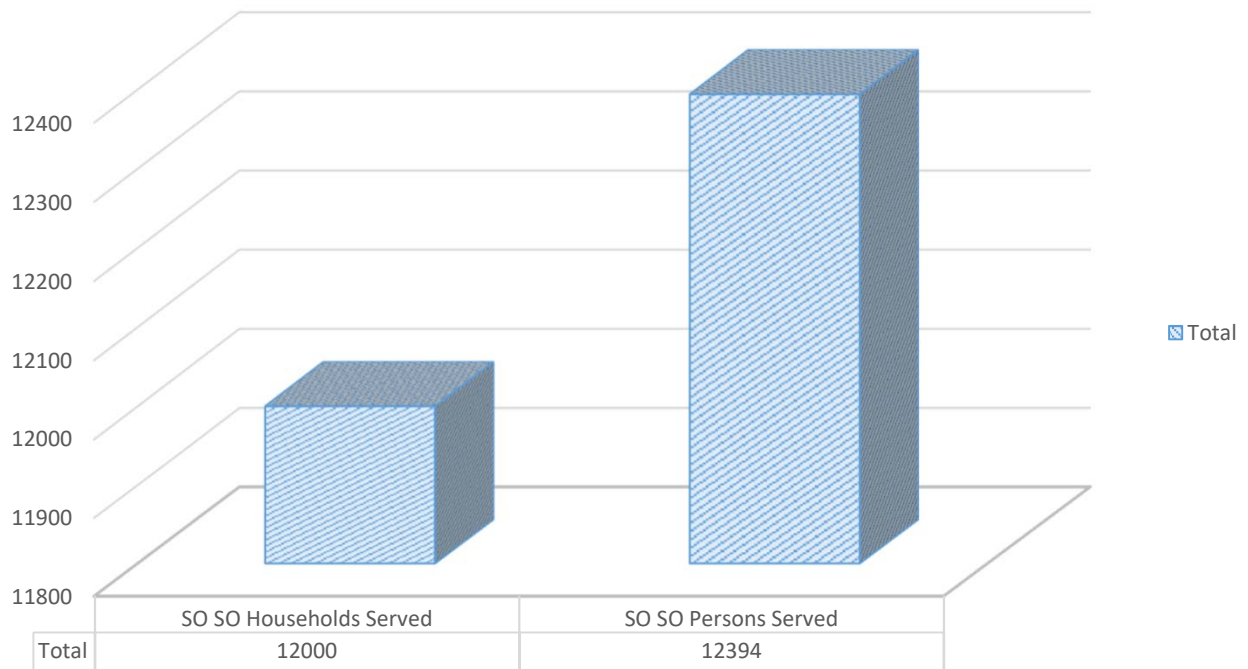

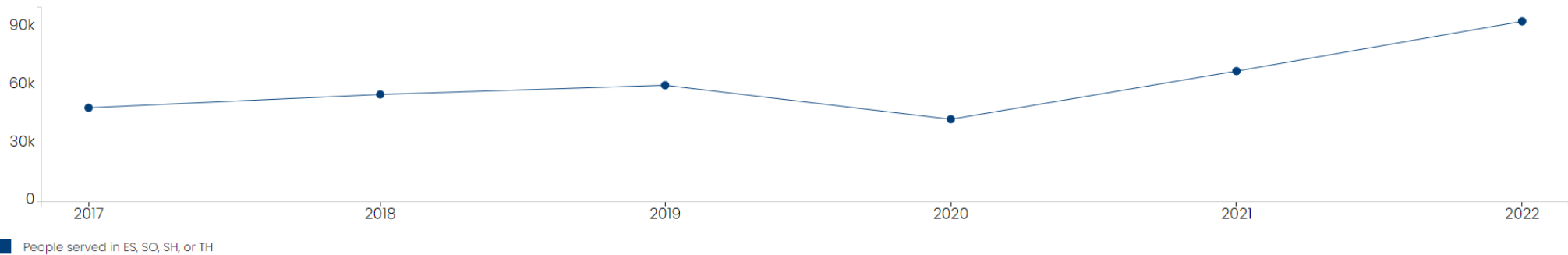

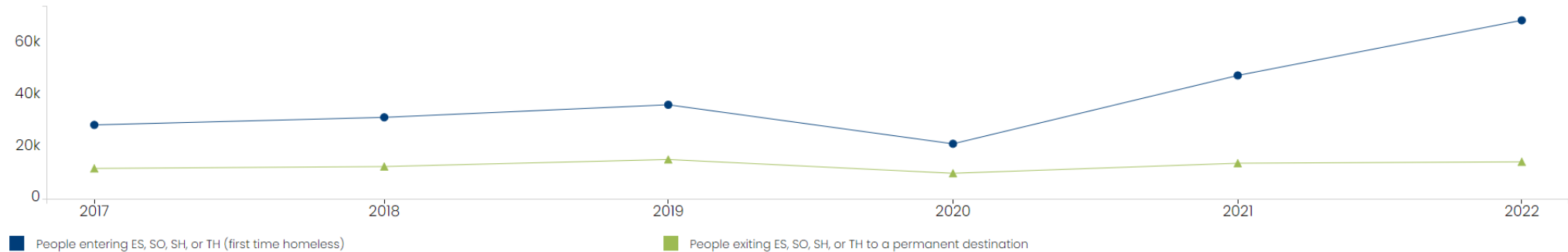

Total Number of People Entering and Exiting Homelessness

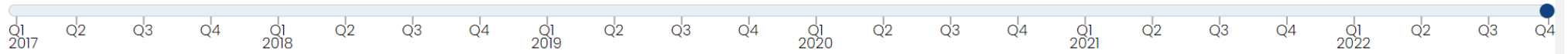


The Statewide Homelessness Report or Data Dashboard includes client statistics pulled from 237 of 254 Texas counties. This data is provided by the Texas Homeless Data Sharing Network (THDSN), which currently receives client-level data from nine (9) of the eleven (11) Continuum of Care (CoC) regions throughout Texas. It is crucial to note that this report captures the **minimum** number of documented homeless individuals or households in Texas.

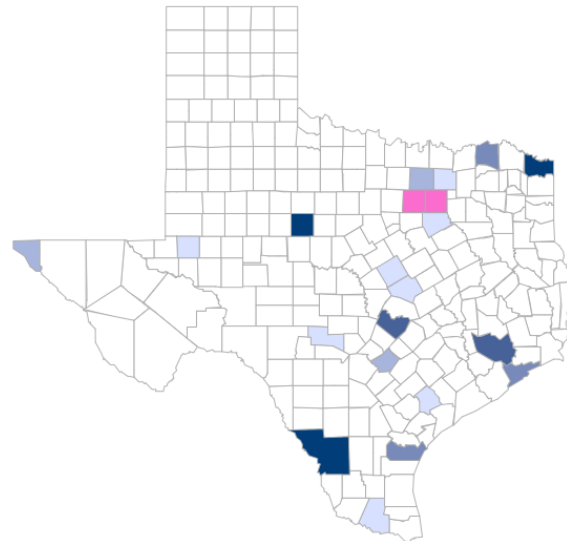

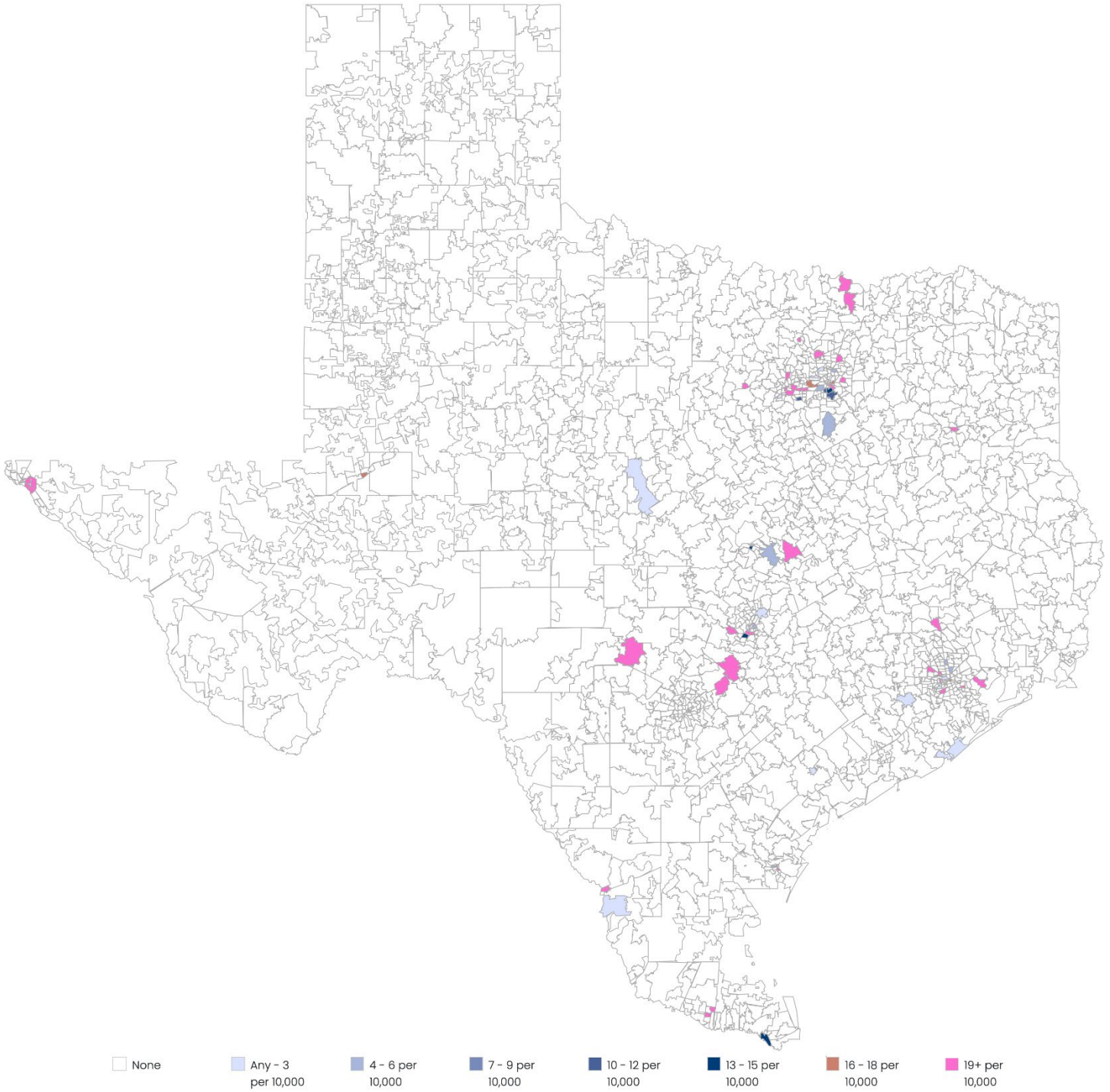

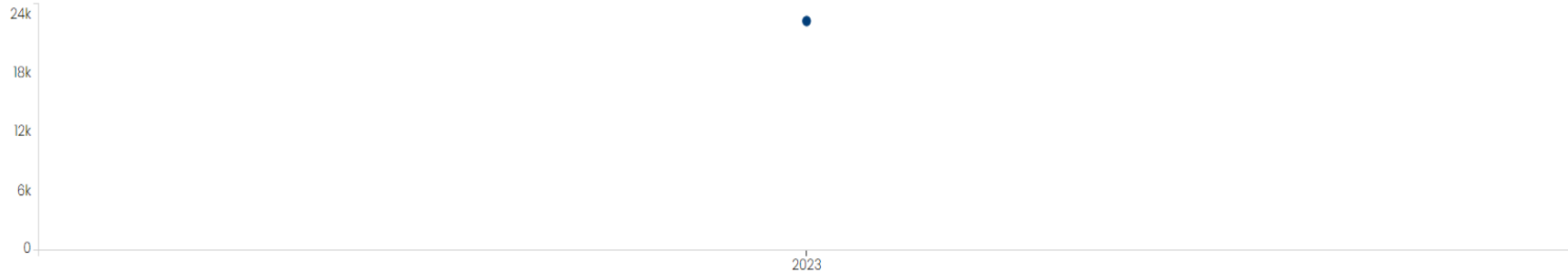

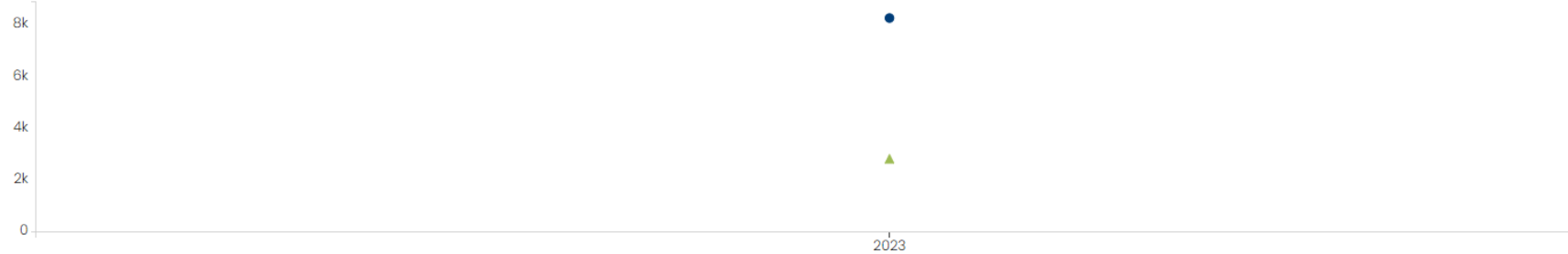

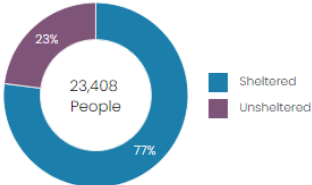

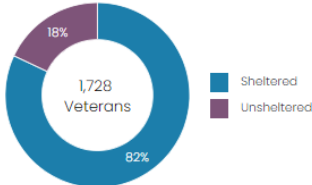

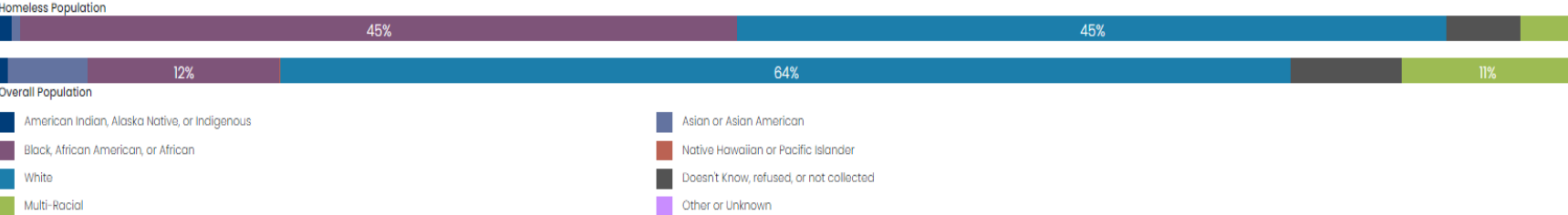
